Home and School Communication



We know that good communication between home and school is a vital part of our partnership. If you need to get a short message to us you can either write a note or speak with the Class Teachers at the beginning or end of the school day. For extended messages may we request you telephone, write us an email and/or set up a meeting with the Class Teacher or other members of staff as required. Reading



Reading is prioritised at Cedars. A record of your child's reading is important and communication with school regarding this is important too. Your child will have brought home a Reading

Record. Please see the Homework Policy for year group expectations.

School Uniform

There is a school uniform which all children are expected to wear, and we very much value parents' support in maintaining high standards of school dress.

We also ask for your support in not sending children to school wearing trainers unless it is PE Day (black shoes are the uniform), makeup, nail varnish or jewellery (the only exception being for children with pierced ears who may wear one sleeper or stud in the lobe of each ear but, for reasons of safety, these must be removed or covered with a plaster for PE and Games lessons). Please ensure that all uniform and coats are named

All items of standard school wear can be purchased from any shop of your own choice. Cedars' uniform is supplied by My Clothing (formerly Tesco) (online) and Maisies (in store or online), and all items ordered attract a 5% donation for the school. Cycling and Scootering to School



If your child would like to cycle or scooter to school this academic year, we would request that your child wears a suitable helmet, have a roadworthy bike/scooter and have had basic instruction in cycle/road safety. Children in Reception to Year 4 must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

Fruit, Healthy Snacks and Water



We are very pleased that children in Nursery, Reception and Years 1 and 2 are provided with a healthy fruit or vegetable snack during the school day. In line with promoting a healthy lifestyle all children in Years 3-6 are encouraged to bring their own healthy snack to have during morning play - this should be fruit, vegetables or dried fruit (snack bars or any other sort of biscuit/crisp snacks are not permitted). I would also like to remind parents that children should not bring nuts or nut containing products into school as we have some children that have severe Nut Allergies.

We also ask that parents supply a suitable water bottle for their child to have in school. During the day water bottles are stored in a tray in the classroom and it is therefore vital that bottles are clearly named. For hygiene reasons water bottles will need to be taken home at the end of each day for washing.

Medical

If your child needs to use an inhaler in school, please ensure you send the inhaler into school, clearly labelled with your child's name. You will need to sign and return a medical form as soon as possible please. Medical Forms can be found on our website as follows: Information - Find out more - Parent Forms.

If there have been any changes to your child's medical condition please let your child's class teacher know.

School Hot Lunches

Children in Reception and Years 1 & 2 receive their hot meals free of charge (paid for by the government). The cost for children in Key Stage 2 (Years 3-6) is £2.50 per day. Some children in Key Stage 2 will be entitled to a hot meal also paid for by the government. If you think your child is entitled to a free meal, please speak with the School Office Team or follow the link on our website under 'Information', 'Food and Drink at School'. Mobile Telephones

I would like to remind everyone about the school policy on the use of mobile phones. Children should not bring mobile phones or any other portable electrical devices into school. If children in Year 5 or Year 6 are coming to school independently of a parent and for safety reasons parents wish their child to have a mobile phone for the journey, they must be handed to their class teacher at the start of the school day. Should you wish to have us look after a phone for your child, please complete a request form (on the website as follows: Information - Find out more - Parent Forms.) Any phones found in school which are not registered with us will be taken into safe keeping and will only be returned to an adult.

Children are not permitted to use mobile phones on the school premises - this

includes making/receiving calls or messages and using devices for recording (audio or images). The school will regard any transgression regarding the use of mobile phones, as a serious breach of our Attitudes and Behaviour Policy.

ParentMail

Please can I remind you that we do not usually send home paper copies of whole school communication. This is to try and reduce copying costs and administration and in many cases we often find that newsletters and letters stay crumpled in the bottom of children's bags. We publish newsletters and letters on our school website and our preferred method of post is email - this means that whole school communication can be emailed directly to parents on the day of publication and saves the age-old problem of the lost communication in the bottom of a bag! Newsletters will usually be published on a Friday at the end of each month.
