Early Years

Nursery

This first half term has been all about learning how to get along together, how to share and how to be more independent and care for ourselves. We encourage the children to say "I can't do it - YET!" when faced with a challenge and celebrate when challenges are achieved.

As well as learning to get along, the children have been doing lots of activities that support their physical development - from roller painting on the shed, rolling tyres and climbing trees.



As Autumn has arrived early this year, we have been looking at seasonal changes and watched the leaves in the nursery garden change colour and start to fall. To support the children's language development we have been reading lots of stories, singing nursery rhymes and learned the poem 'Roar' as part of Poetry Week.

Reception

Reception children have had a fantastic start to their first year at school. Since the first day, we have had lots of smiles and enthusiastic faces entering the classroom every day! We have spent this





half term learning the new rules and routines of the school day, learning our friends' names and enjoying finding out all about our school. We have started learning to read and write

individual sounds in phonics and have enjoyed taking home books to share with our grown-ups. We have worked on our fine motor skills and have had fun cutting playdough, making marks in different materials and completing weekly timed challenges. Well done Bears Class!

Years 5 and 6

We have had a very positive start to our new year, with lots of excellent learning taking place. The children have shown great positivity towards our topic of 'Darwin's Delight' and created some fantastic work that the teachers are very proud of.

Last week, we welcomed Dr Ian Parker-Heath - a pre-history and archaeology expert - into school to lead our 'Stone Age to Iron Age Workshop'. The children thoroughly enjoyed excavating artefacts, grinding grains to make flour and creating replica prehistoric pottery. It was so lovely to see them applying all that they have learned in our History lessons this half term and discussing their learning like historians.

Year 6 enjoyed a trip to Ousedale this week to watch their production of 'The Addams Family' as part of our transition work. The students from Ousedale put on a fantastic show and the children loved the performance.

Finally, it was lovely to welcome so many parents and carers into school for this half term's Celebration of Learning. I'm sure you will all agree that the children are working incredibly hard and should be very proud of their achievements this half term. We would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your continued support and wish you a safe and restful half term.

Years 1 and 2

Years 1 and 2 have had a great start to the year showing us what superstars they are in so many ways. The children have loved all the work we have done on the story of Little Red Riding Hood. If you managed to get to our Celebration of Learning, we hope you enjoyed our whole class re-telling.

Last week we had the pleasure of welcoming Mr Hoffman (Lucas' Dad) into school to talk to the children about his experiences in Kenya. The children have been finding out where Kenya is and what it might be like there. Mr Hoffman showed photos of some of the people he met and the animals and landscapes he saw. He told us about life and schools in Kenya as well as sharing some stories about eating every part of a fish (including the eyes) and monkeys stealing biscuits!
