Dear Parents/Carers,

What a busy term! The children have been working hard, making good progress and I have been very impressed with their enthusiasm, resilience and manners. All the staff and children have made me feel very welcomed to the school and I am looking forward to being part of the continuing onward learning journey for Cedars.

Year 2 and Year 6 have been completing their SATs this half term and we are all proud of their hard work and commitment throughout the year. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff involved for their dedication to the children. We now wait for the results in July!

It has been lovely to see so many parents attend our celebration of learning this week. The children really enjoy sharing their school life with you and please do continue to support your child at home by reading regularly with them.

A quick reminder that from September the school day will be changing. The gates will open at 8.30am. The teachers will be welcoming in the children at 8.35am and registration will be prompt at 8.45am. The school day will continue to finish at 3.15pm.

Attendance



Good attendance leads to academic success. At Cedars we would like every child to have an attendance of 97%. The school day starts at 8:45 am and it is important that the children arrive on time so that they can settle quickly and be ready to learn.

Each week in assembly we will be announcing which class or classes had the highest attendance for the week.

Nursery

This half term, our learning has focused on traditional tales. We have had lots of fun with a variety of stories and with our latest story of The Three Little Pigs the children have been heard 'huffing and puffing' as they re-enact the story though their play. The Penguins, have built houses from all sorts of different materials and their ability to create enclosed structures has really developed. We have looked at different types of buildings and structures, such as houses and bridges. We have begun to learn about different materials such as wood, brick, glass and plastic and about the properties of the materials they are made from

We have continued to observe the changes to our school environment and are super excited that we are now finding lots of insects and mini beasts in the garden.

We regularly enjoy going down to the Activity Hall to do 'Sticky Kids' - a mixture of singing and movement, to build up our strength, coordination and listening skills.

We have been learning to talk about our emotions and looking closely at how different characters might be feeling in the stories we have read and how those emotions link to our Zones of Regulation. The nursery staff wish you all a happy holiday and look forward to sharing more learning next term.



Reception

This half term Bears Class have explored a vast range of traditional tales. We have learnt new vocabulary, retold stories and made up our own fairy tales. We have looked at what was the same and what was different in the stories we have read and made a chart to display our findings. We have really enjoyed the sunshine and have spent a lot of time developing our gross motor skills outside, building obstacle courses and inventing games to play. We had lots of fun during our Coronation week and learnt about Kings and Queens from the past, what they wore and where they lived. We made cucumber sandwiches to help improve our cutting skills too! We have begun sharing our opinions about stories so please ask us what our favourite fairy tale is and we'd love to tell you all about it!





Years 1 and 2

In KS1 this half term the children have really enjoyed putting sound effects and songs to a story in music – we had some amazing vocal accompaniments for an over-flowing magic porridge pot! We have been into space in our History and English lessons! Oliver Jeffers provided the inspiration for our writing with his book 'The Way Back Home' and we found out about Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin landing on the moon; we even went for a moon walk ourselves! We finished off our space topic by making Moon Buggies with hinges (doors) and axles and wheels - phew! We hope this weather holds and you have a lovely half term.

Years 3 and 4

During Science learning in Years 3 and 4 this half term, the children have been discovering how their food is digested. They have explored different types of teeth they have, and their functions as well as being able to develop a deeper understanding about the importance of looking after their teeth. The children have looked at the process and journey food goes on when being digested, and created models of a digestive system to help them explain what happens. This was great fun, but also very messy!

A very memorable part of our half term was the Design and Technology project based on textiles. The children have designed and made their own bags, including sewing fabric to join pieces together and attaching a button to open and close their bag. The standard of work produced was excellent and the children enjoyed deciding what special things they might keep in their bag. They were desperate to take them home to share! Thank you to parents and carers for sending in a range of fabric and buttons for the children to use.

Years 5 and 6

There has been much to celebrate in Upper Key Stage 2 this half term. The Year 6 children worked incredibly hard during their SATs week and should be very proud of themselves. All the staff were so impressed with the confidence and resilience they showed, they were superstars! Year 5 were extremely supportive and adaptable during this week too and produced some fantastic work.

Over the course of this half term, both Year 5 and 6 have created some wonderful work, including biographies of Christiaan Barnard, photomontages inspired by the artist Hannah Hoch and studied the biomes of South America. During our celebration of learning, the children enjoyed working with their grown-ups to create our very own 'Pillars for UKS2' sculpture inspired by the community projects Alfredo and Isabel Aquilizan.


As we draw this busy, but successful, half term to a close, we hope you have a lovely break and look forward to seeing you all back for our final half term of the year.
