# Reception

Well done Reception on completing your first year of school. We've had a fantastic half term exploring the beach. We have learnt about all the different animals that live in the sea and on the seashore and we have created fantastic artwork using all the skills we have developed throughout the year. Our highlight of this half term was watching caterpillars grow. We watched them grow bigger by the day, turn into chrysalids and then eventually emerge as beautiful butterflies.
