Keira told the children that The Parks Trust looks after 45 parks and 3 ancient woodlands. The children learnt about littering and the impact it has on wildlife and the environment. They were very keen to ask lots of questions and they all understood they should put their litter in a bin or take it home.

# Free School Meals

If you are receiving certain benefits, a FREE tasty and nutritious school meal is available for your children at Cedars Primary School. You could be eligible even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and receiving Universal Free School meals.

The benefits of registering for Free School Meals are:

- A free school meal for your child, which is good for their health and could help their learning.
- Savings for you, worth over £420 a year.
- Extra money for the school through Pupil Premium, worth at least £900 a year.

Remember, just registering your child for Free School Meals means that Cedars Primary School receives the extra money even if you don't take up the free meal. No one will know you have registered and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming.

#### White Rose 1-Minute Maths



In our school, we use a scheme called White Rose Maths to teach our children. There is a free maths app which can help children of all ages build greater number fluency and confidence. Your child can choose any topic and then they answer a unique series of questions. If they're struggling with a question, a 'Hint' button will give a helpful clue by showing the question in a different, but familiar way. When one minute is up, they'll see a feedback screen telling them how they've done. You can download the app free from the Amazon Store, Google Play or the Apple App Store.
