Welcome back to school! We hope you have all had a good half term break.

In Maths this half term, Year 5 will be focusing on factors, multiples and fractions. Year 6 will be working on fractions and shape, converting units and position. Both year groups will continue to work on their fluency skills.

This half term our English lessons will be working on instruction writing and non-chronological reports. We will also continue to focus on spelling and the grammar work completed in Autumn 1.

In History, we will be investigating local histories from the Victorian to the interwar period. The children will learn about the census, its purpose and its changes over time.

In Art, we will be exploring the purpose and impact of images from the 'Space race' era of the 1950s and 60s; developing independence and decision-making using open-ended and experimental processes; combining drawing and collagraph printmaking to create a futuristic image.

In Science, Year 5 we will be broadening their experience of the properties of materials, investigating hardness, transparency and conductivity and considering how these properties influence the uses of materials. We will also explore reversible changes, including dissolving and changes of state. Year 6 will be proving that light travels in a straight line and using this information to explain observations of reflection and shadows. The children will investigate the effect of moving an object away from the surface it casts a shadow on and the relationship between the incoming and reflected rays on a mirrored surface.

We will also be doing:

- RE considering the question 'Are all religions are equal?' and looking at sacred texts
- PE choreographing and performing a West Side Story inspired dance
- PSHE exploring different perceptions about what normal means and celebrating our differences
- Computing coding to make simple games
- Music listening to the work of Mendelssohn and further developing improvisation and composition skills

Core Texts

The core text we will be reading this half term is Holes by Louis Sachar

Homework

We will be setting homework this half term in line with the homework policy:

- Maths and English homework are set every Thursday and is due in the following Tuesday.
- Children are expected to read a minimum of five times per week and this is to be recorded in their planners (Year 6) or reading records (Year 5).
- Children should access TT Rock Stars for a minimum of 10 minutes daily. It is important that all children are able to recall their times table and division facts **randomly** and **at speed**.
- Throughout the year, additional spelling, punctuation and grammar homework may also be set to support the learning taking place at school.

Important information

Don't forget that every day the children need: a re-fillable water bottle, book bag to hold their reading record, spelling book and reading book and their lunch box (if they are not having school dinners).
