Reception

Next half term, we are looking forward to comparing hot and cold countries and looking at how animals adapt to live in hot and cold climates.

Nursery

Year 5

Year 5 have enjoyed using West Side Story as inspiration during dance lessons to perform Capoeira - a Brazilian martial art. The children were so proud of their writing that they published it to make a wonderful display.

Year 1

Year 2

Year 2 worked hard this half term to put together their Nativity performance of 'We Three Kings'. The children enjoyed learning their lines and singing the songs. The performances to their grown ups were Oscar worthy! In science, the children have been busy learning about mini beasts and micro habitats. They took part in their own mini beast hunt on the trim trail and then carried out an investigation all about woodlice.

In Year 2 the children had to use the numbers 1 to 9 to solve some calculations.



Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 had a go at solving yohaku problems, which involved adding and multiplying numbers to find amounts.



All the children showed great perseverance and enjoyed coming up with the solutions to their problems. They got to develop their mathematical thinking and problem-solving skills.
