

Once Upon a Time

Our topic this half term is **Once Upon a Time**, and we will be exploring lots of different traditional tales. The children will become familiar with repeated phrases, begin to retell the stories and sequence them in their play. They will explore the different characters and settings through art and role play activities. We will look at what these stories have in common and what is different about them and have lots of fun acting them out. Our Core text is ‘Charlie Cook’s favourite book’ by Julia Donaldson. We will use this story as inspiration for the children to create their own books developing imagination and independent thinking. We will continue to explore growing plants and looking at a wide variety of life cycles including that of a frog, ladybird and butterfly.

Our Maths focus is about ordering numbers. This focus help to support securing children’s understanding of the stable order counting principle to 3. Another counting principle that is developed in this topic is the abstraction principle. This is the understanding that anything can be counted. We will be providing opportunities to count things other than objects, such as sounds and actions.

Supporting your child at home

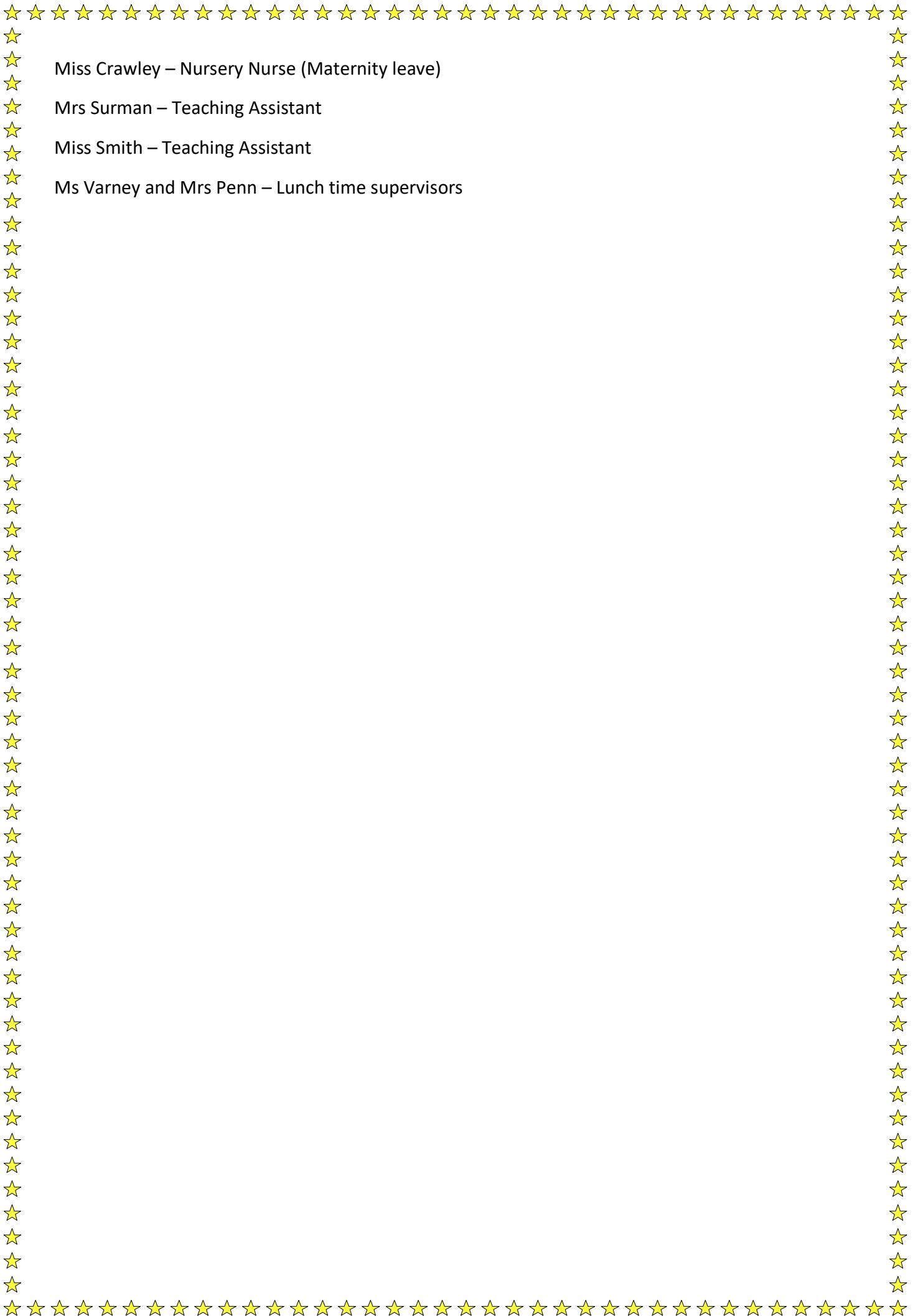
- Read traditional stories and fairy tales to your child.
